



Checking your volume levels when playing back online worship services.

A couple of folks have expressed difficulty in hearing different aspects of the services played on line and reported that even increasing their volume level to maximum, it is still too soft.

I was able to check the videos played online via the churches' websites and have found no problem getting ample volume. So I have to wonder if there is no problem with the computers being used, then a check of the volume controls available to everyone is in order.

I've created this brief "how-to" to help anyone who is having difficulty hearing the spoken word.

When viewing videos on YouTube, everyone has 2 different volume controls and each one can override the other, so it's important to check on both.

The above image highlights these 2 volume controls when using a Windows PC computer.

Highlight #1 shows a volume control right in YouTube. I generally set this volume level right to the maximum. When you first see it, you just see the small speaker icon 

When you move your mouse cursor over that icon, the current volume level will show itself (see the inset image that the #1 red arrow points to). Left click on the little dot of the volume slider in that image, and slide all the way to the right to set the YouTube control to the max.

#2 shows where your volume control of your computer usually resides. Left click on the speaker icon found at the lower left corner of your screen, and you will see a similar control like on the YouTube video. With the YouTube volume set to maximum, you then only need to worry about 1 volume control and that's the one for your computer.

I hope this helps anyone that may have difficulty getting the volume levels right for your convenience.
